Note: This workbook historically contained three tables. Beginning in 2018 Report Card Data request, Table 2 related to Other Health Sciences Graduates has been removed. Table 3 related to Medical School Graduate Retention in Primary Care has been renamed Table 3.

Table 1: Medical School Graduates in West Virginia

Note: this worksheet includes formulas that auto total the data that is entered for each county to provide county totals and statewide totals.

This worksheet is composed of two sections. The top section requires you to enter data by county for six years of graduating classes. The bottom section auto-populates some information pulled from the top section and also requires you to enter some information for each graduating class related to the institution's total number of graduates and total number of graduates with completed training. Unlike other Report Card worksheets, this worksheet collects real time data and data from prior year's submissions is not used.

Years listed apply to graduating medical school classes. For example, data entered under 2013 is for the graduating class of 2013, which includes any student who graduated between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013.

Total Number of Graduates – Do not enter any county level data into the worksheet for this column. At the bottom of the worksheet in the total section, enter into this column the total number of members of each graduating class.

Number of Graduates with Completed Training – Do not enter any county level data into the worksheet for this column. At the bottom of the worksheet in the total section, enter the total number of members of the graduating class who presently have completed residency training. Do not include members of the graduating class who are still in residency or fellowship programs.

Number of Graduates Practicing in West Virginia – the number of members of a graduating class who currently are practicing in any county in West Virginia.

Number of Graduates Practicing in Rural Areas – the number of members of a graduating class who currently are practicing in a rural area of any West Virginia county. Rural is defined using the official definition of rural adopted by the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, which is a 2006 RUCA Code score of 4 or higher for the practice zip code. You can download the codes at: <http://depts.washington.edu/uwruca/ruca-download.php>. The codes have been updated for various years, be sure to use the 2006 listing.

Number of Graduates Practicing Primary Care – the number of members of a graduating class who currently are practicing primary care in each West Virginia county. Primary care is family medicine, internal medicine, internal medicine/pediatrics, obstetrics/gynecology, and pediatrics.

Table 2: 2013 West Virginia Medical School Graduates: Retention in Primary Care in West Virginia

Data reported in this worksheet is for medical school graduates of the Class of 2013, which includes any student who graduated between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013.

Number of Graduates with Completed West Virginia Primary Care Residencies – The number of members of the graduating class who completed primary care residencies in West Virginia.

Number of Graduates with Completed Primary Care Residencies in West Virginia Practicing in West Virginia – The number of members of the graduating class who completed primary care residencies in West Virginia and are now practicing in West Virginia.

Number of Graduates with Completed Out-of-State Primary Care Residencies – The number of members of the graduating class who completed primary care residencies outside of West Virginia.

Number of Graduates with Completed Out-of-State Primary Care Residencies Practicing in West Virginia – The number of members of the graduating class who completed primary care residencies outside of West Virginia and have now returned to West Virginia to practice.
