Why Did We Do The Study?

- * The number of pediatric dentists has grown, yet disparities continue
- * Evidence suggests that more treatment is being provided to young children, and those from underrepresented groups
- * Previous studies show that pediatric dentists fill a niche in the oral care system that no other group addresses
- * Frankly, no one else was addressing these pediatric workforce issues
