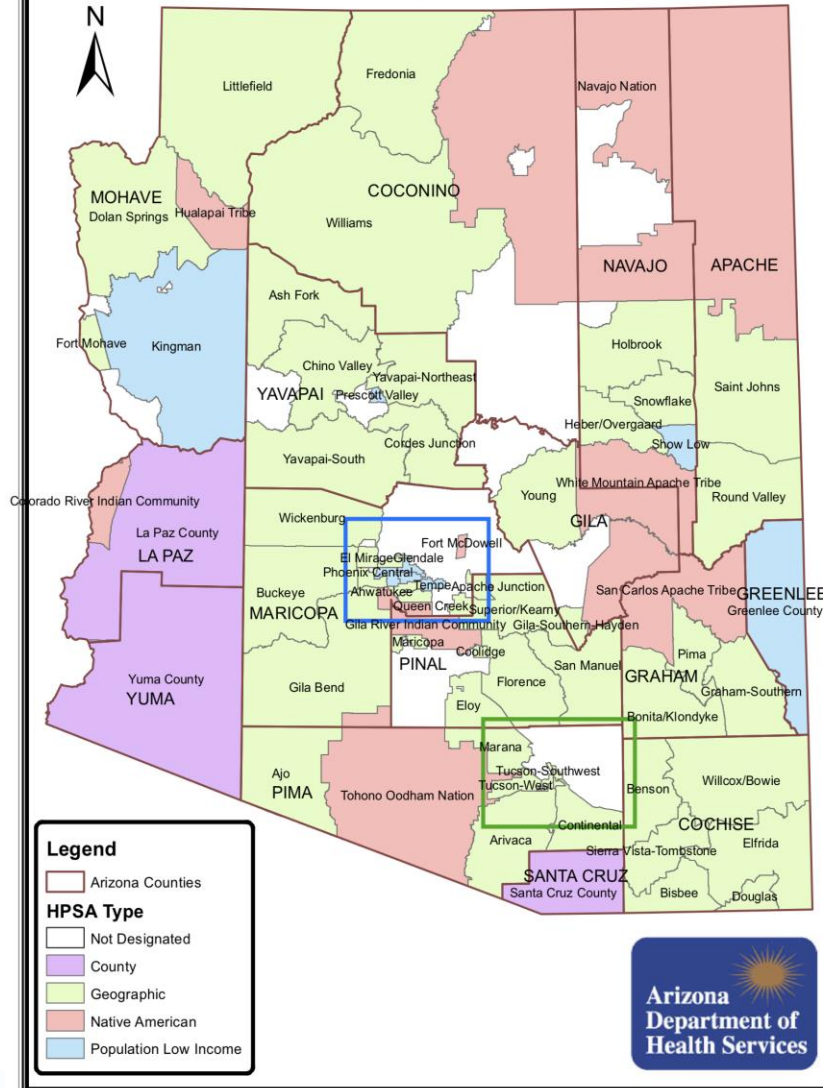

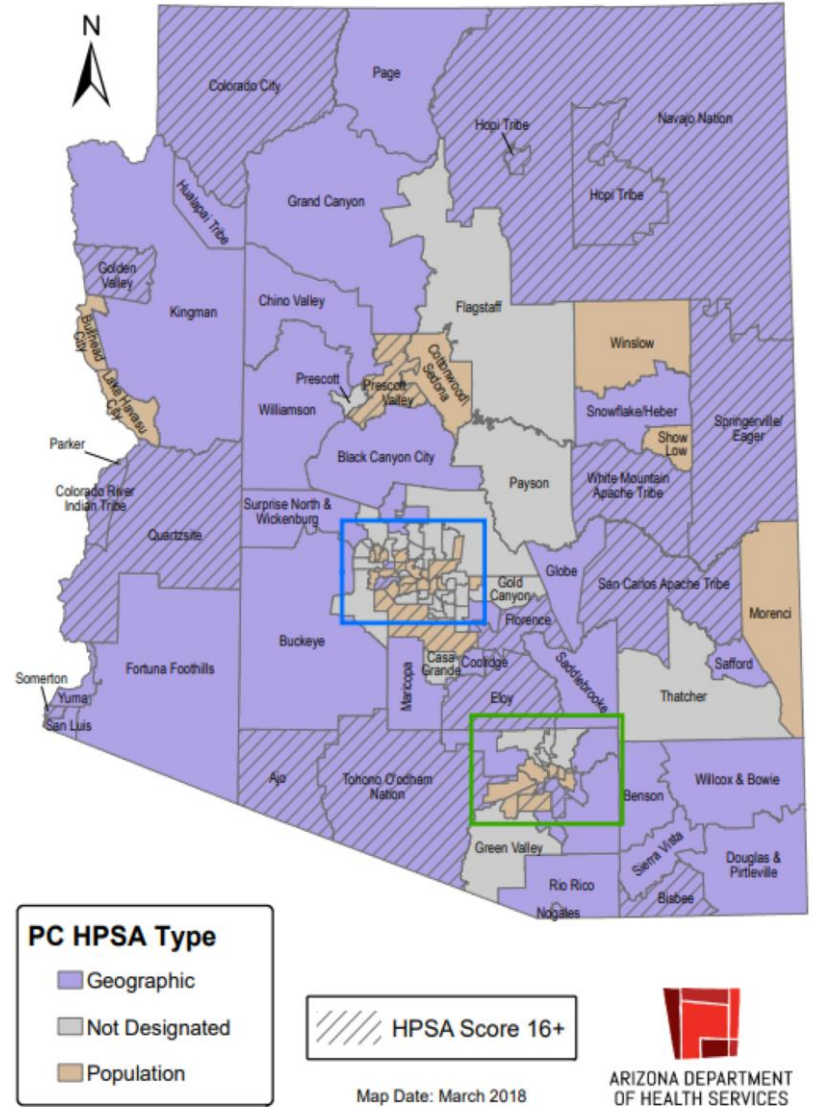

- 2) Drafting – translating to bill language
- 3) Legislative – persuading policymakers
- 4) Appropriations – financing
- 5) Implementation – rulemaking
- 6) Maintenance – defending gains

Starting Jan 2 2020, each regulatory board must collect designated database information

Identifies ADHS to prescribe the designated database information
