Why Did We Do The Study?

- The number of pediatric dentists has grown, yet disparities continue
- Evidence suggests that more treatment is being provided to young children, and those from underrepresented groups
- Previous studies show that pediatric dentists fill a niche in the oral care system that no other group addresses
- Frankly, no one else was addressing these pediatric workforce issues





What's At Stake?

- A healthy pediatric dental workforce means healthy children
- Health care reform seems imminent and we want to be prepared with data
- The federal program responsible for our growth merits review
